<p><b>A is for Arches</b></p> <p>Utah's is famous for its natural arches in Moab, Utah at Arches National Park.</p>	<p><b>B is for Beehive State</b></p> <p>Utah's state nickname is the Beehive State, symbolizing industry and hard work.</p>	<p><b>C is for Coal &amp; Copper</b></p> <p>Coal is Utah's state rock. Over 6 billion tons of copper have been removed from Utah mines since 1906.</p>
<p><b>D is for Dixie</b></p> <p>Pioneers began farming cotton in southern UT during the Civil War. They built a cotton factory and produced fabric there.</p>	<p><b>E is for Rocky Mountain Elk</b></p> <p>This is the state mammal. They live mostly in the mountains. They weigh up to 950 lbs.</p>	<p><b>F is for Four Corners</b></p> <p>The only place in the United States where four states touch: Utah, Colorado, Arizona and New Mexico</p>
<p><b>G is for California Gull</b></p> <p>This is Utah's state bird. During the pioneer's first year in UT, the gull saved crops be eating swarms of crickets.</p>	<p><b>H is for Handcarts</b></p> <p>Many pioneers came to Utah bringing all they had in handcarts weighing 500 lbs.</p>	<p><b>I is for Irrigation</b></p> <p>Irrigation ditches collect mountain snows in Utah supplying water to the crops and reservoirs.</p>
<p><b>J is for Jim Bridger and Jedediah Smith</b></p> <p>They were mountain men and trappers. They were some of the first non-natives to enter Utah.</p>	<p><b>K is for Kolff and Jarvik</b></p> <p>They were doctors at the University of Utah who developed the first artificial heart</p>	<p><b>L is for Great Salt Lake</b></p> <p>This is the largest salt lake in the western hemisphere. It has enough salt to supply the world's needs for 1,000 yrs.</p>
<p><b>M is for Mormon Tabernacle Choir</b></p> <p>A world famous choir of 320 members that sings in Salt Lake City- and around the world.</p>	<p><b>N is for Native Americans</b></p> <p>Many tribes lived in Utah anciently and still today. The State was named after the Ute tribes.</p>	<p><b>O is for the Outlaw Bunch</b></p> <p>Butch Cassidy and other outlaws often rode through Utah and hid out there.</p>

<p><b>P is for Pony Express</b></p> <p>The Pony Express carried mail by horse back across the country and the route passed through Utah.</p>	<p><b>Q is for Joe Quinney</b></p> <p>He helped form the first ski resort in Utah and developed the Winter Sports Association.</p>	<p><b>R is for Railroad</b></p> <p>Promontory Point in Utah was the place where the East and West Railroads joined in 1869.</p>
<p><b>S is for the Sego Lily</b></p> <p>Utah's state flower- the bulbs of the flower can be eaten and saved many lives during difficult years.</p>	<p><b>T is for Topaz</b></p> <p>This is Utah's state Gem. IT is a golden color and can only be found in 3 states. It is almost as hard as a diamond.</p>	<p><b>U is for Utahraptor</b></p> <p>A dinosaur was discovered in Utah and named after the state! Many other dinosaurs have been found here, too.</p>
<p><b>V is for Vernal</b></p> <p>A city in Utah that has a dinosaur quarry. 350 tons of dinosaur bones have been excavated from here.</p>	<p><b>W is for Wasatch Mountains</b></p> <p>These mountains run from the north to the middle of the state. They were formed by volcanoes and glaciers.</p>	<p><b>X is for Xeriscape</b></p> <p>This is a type of gardening that conserves water by using plants that don't need much water. Utah is the 2<sup>nd</sup> driest state in the country.</p>
<p><b>Y is for Brigham Young</b></p> <p>He led the Mormon pioneers to Utah and helped establish settlements in Utah and states nearby.</p>	<p><b>Z is for Zion National Park</b></p> <p>It has famous red rocks, and canyons. It was the home of the ancient Anasazi people.</p>
