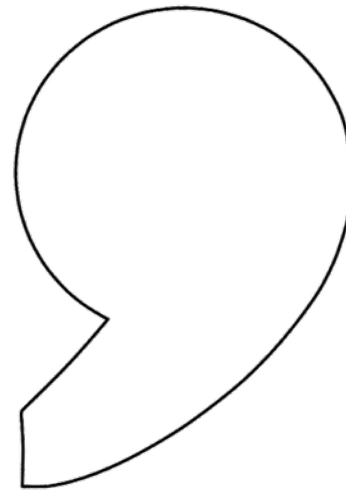
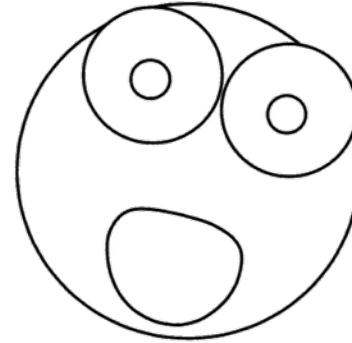
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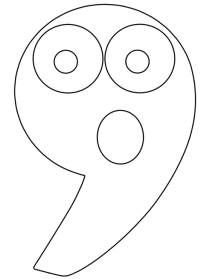
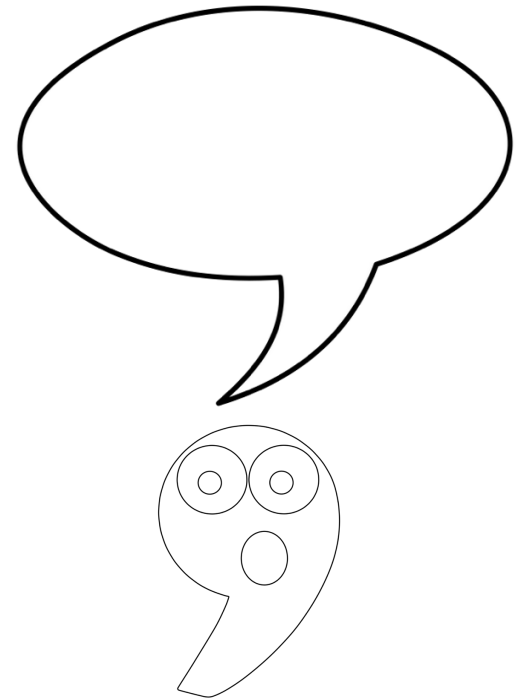
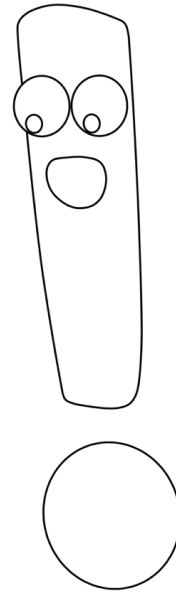
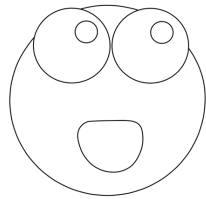
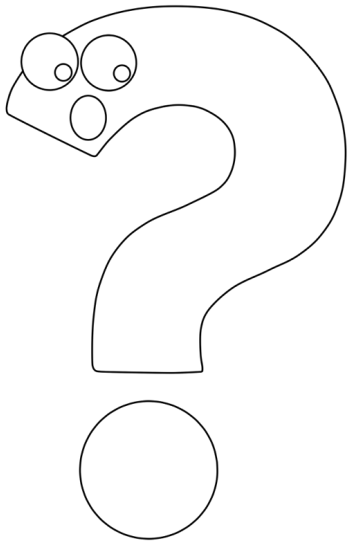




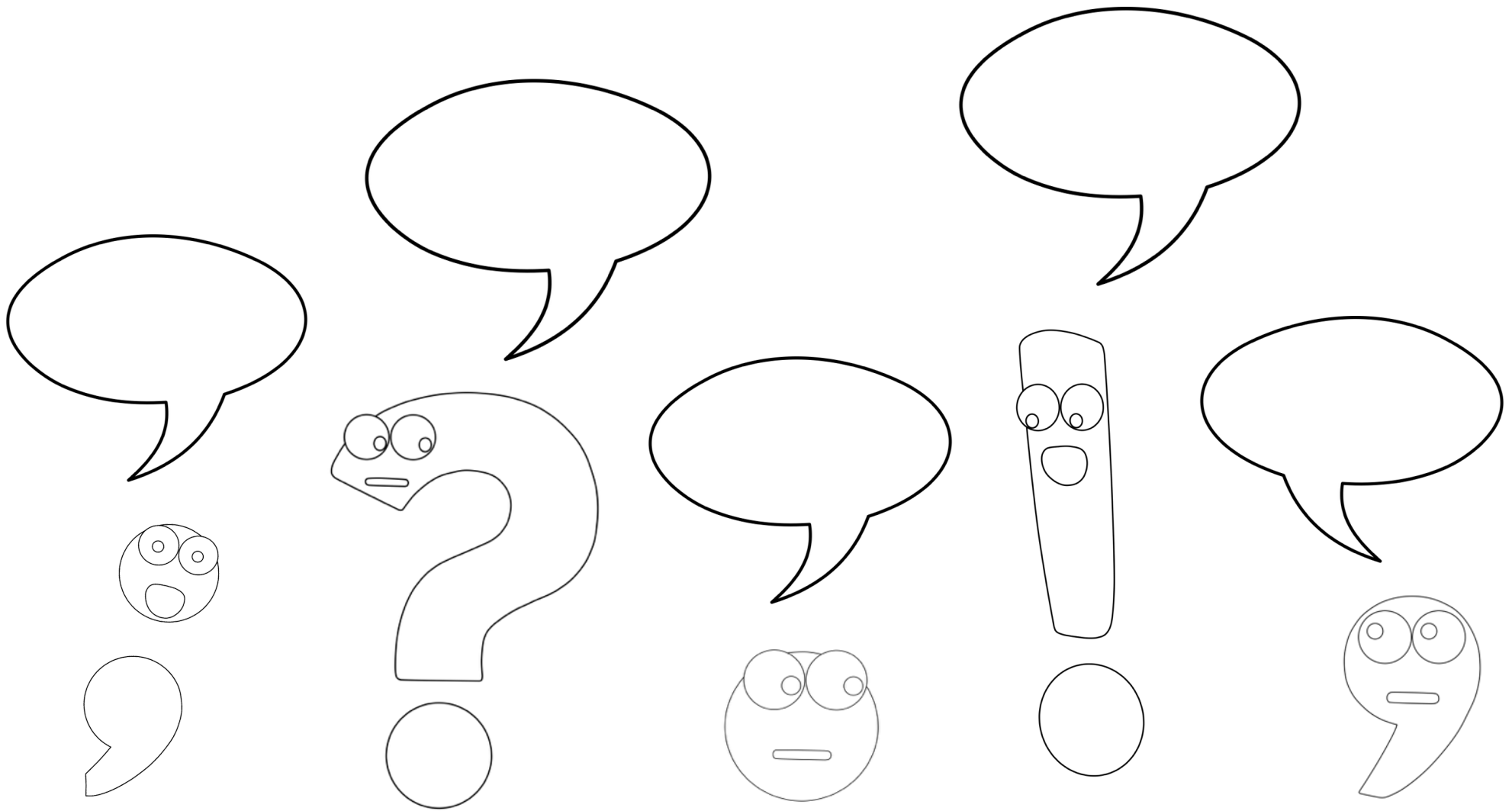






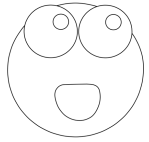








# Punctuation Fact Sheet



## Period

A period is used at the end of a sentence to end a complete thought.



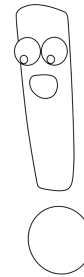
## Comma

A comma can be used to list things. It can also be used in the middle of a sentence to make a short pause between thoughts.



## Question Mark

A question mark is used at the end of a sentence that asks something.



## Exclamation Point

An exclamation point at the end of a sentence shows strong feelings like surprise, anger or fear.



## Semicolon

A semicolon is kind of like a period and kind of like a comma. It is used to join two complete, closely related thoughts.
